

Notice Regarding the Reception of Ukrainian Evacuees

A military invasion by Russia has displaced many people from Ukraine to third countries. In response to this situation, the Prime Minister announced his policy on 2nd March to accept evacuees who have relatives or acquaintances in Japan. Beppu City has decided to provide as much cooperation as possible, including the provision of municipal housing and livelihood support, in the event of a request from the national government to accept evacuees. We also informed the government of our intention to accept Ukrainian displaced persons on 8th March 2022.

Mayor's Message

8th March 2022

Beppu City is a city of international tourism and hot spring culture, and before the COVID-19 disaster, many tourists from overseas enjoyed sightseeing in Beppu. In addition, an international university with many students from abroad is located in the area, and it has served as a place for people from all over the world to interact. We will make preparations to provide municipal housing and livelihood support to Ukrainian refugees who are forced to take refuge in Japan due to Russia's unforgivable military aggression against Ukraine, should the government request it.

Also, through the Japanese Red Cross Society, to support relief efforts in Ukraine and neighboring countries, we will be collecting "Ukraine Humanitarian Crisis Relief Fund" until 31 May 2022 by placing donation boxes at the City Hall and branch offices.

Assistance to Evacuees

- Livelihood support (provision of housing, food, clothing, furniture and appliances, etc., lifestyle counseling, etc.)
- Support needed when pregnant women, infants, children, persons with disabilities, the elderly, etc. are included (e.g., medical checkups, school attendance, nursing care support, etc.)
- Medical support (medical checkups, vaccinations, etc.)

- Language support (arranging interpreters, translation, etc.)
